The 1900 Spartanburg/Pacolet Census listed the household as;

Wife; Fannie 20, born in November 1879

The 1910 Spartanburg/Glendale Census showed Charles and Fannie had been married 10 years and were the parents of 4 children, 1 living.

The household was listed as;

Charles Bogan 30, husband/cotton mill

Wife; Fannie 30

Child; Mable 4

No other records were found.



The Family of Perrin Bogan, believed to be the son of Isaac and Mary Ann Bogan;

The 1910 Spartanburg/Glendale Census showed they had been married 5 years and were the parents of 2 children, none living.

The household was listed as;

Perrin Bogan, 22, husband

Wife; Zenie 19

The Family of J. Grady Bogan, son of Isaac and Mary Ann Bogan;

The 1940 Spartanburg/Beech Springs Census listed the household as;

J. Luther Bogan 35, husband/spinner Wife; Edna C. 35, Spinner

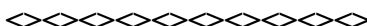
Child; Ray b. 6

Wife; Lavada 22

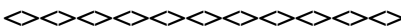
Children; Catherine 4years, 7 months

Writer's comments; According to the census records I have seen, it appears that Isaac and Jeff Bogan were brothers and were the sons of Alsa (Alsey)and Elizabeth or Jane Bogan. Due to slight differences in ages, I was unable to confirm that. A young boy named Alsa, is buried in Isaac's cemetery square. This writer knew only the Jessie C. and Lavada Bogan family. "Jess" and "Vada" as we knew and called them, were dear friends of our family. They were fine people and hard workers. Jess was a real mechanic. They moved to Arcadia, S. C. and became involved in the Pentecostal movement.
