Was a <u>Civil War soldier in the Confederate army</u> – Co. B 15<sup>th</sup> SC Infantry Regiment, Connor's Brigade.

Wounded at Second Manassas Aug. 30, 1862, and at Chancellorsville, May 3, 1863. Unable to continue as an infantry soldier, he was assigned as sergeant in charge of couriers for Col. James L. Corley, Chief Quartermaster, and Col. R. G. Cole, Chief Commissary Officer, on General Robert E. Lee's General staff.

Obtained one of the few copies of General Order #9, Lee's Farewell Address, signed by General Lee. Many believe this is the most historic General Order of the Confederacy.

Joined Putman Baptist Church Nov.18, 1860 and was baptized into its fellowship by Rev. John Gibbs, his future father-in-law.

Elected deacon at Putman Baptist Church June 1865.

Elected Church Clerk at Putman in June 1868 and served in that capacity until Feb. 1892 when he moved to <u>Glendale</u>, Spartanburg County, SC.

Was principally engaged in farming during his years at Putman Church.

After moving to <u>Glendale</u> in 1892 he became the Magistrate, and he soon became familiarly known as "Judge" in the community.

Joined Glendale Baptist Church and served as deacon, Sunday School Superintendent and teacher.

Master Mason – first at Union, SC. Lodge No. 75 - Later at the Glendale Lodge No. 271.

Because of declining health, in January 1925, he moved to the home of his son, <u>Jesse Broadus "Broad"</u> <u>Williams</u>, and daughter-in-law <u>Bertie Clyde Sutton</u>. At the time "Broad" was Superintendent of the Graniteville and Hickman Textile Mills.

Died Feb. 5,1926 in Graniteville, SC at the home of his son.

His **obituary** was written by well known minister **Rev J. D. Bailey**, his friend for more than 40 years.
