Excerpts from the Obituary of Fred L. Cash published Friday, June 28, 1968;

“Fred Lester Cash, 57, husband of Mrs. Elva Warren Cash, son of the late John and Corrie Major Cash, died Thursday in the Spartanburg General Hospital after a brief illness. He was a veteran of World War II, a member of the [Glendale](#) Masonic Lodge and attended the [Glendale Baptist Church](#).

Survivors were; sisters, Mrs. Ed Rush, Mrs. Earnest Alley, Mrs. Otto Williams and Miss. Lucille Cash.”

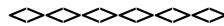
No arrangements were published. Interment was in the [Glendale Community Cemetery](#).

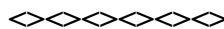

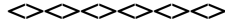
Funeral arrangements were not included.

“Miss Ruth Lucille Cash, 63, died Tuesday in the General Hospital after a long illness. She was a member of the [Glendale United Methodist Church](#); A World War II Women of the Army (WAC) veteran; daughter of the late John and Corrie Major Cash.

No census records were found.

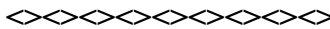
A. Otto Williams died at the age of 74 in August, 1974.

Excerpts from the Obituary of Mrs. Otto Williams published Tuesday, March 18, 1997;  
“Ruby Cash Williams, died March 16, 1997 in the Wallace Thompson Hospital in Union, S. C. following a brief illness.

A native of Converse, she was the widow of A. Otto Williams and the daughter of John R. and Corrie Major Cash. She was a member of the First Baptist Church of Union.

Survivors include; two daughters, Mary Ellen Williams and Jeanne Williams of the home; three grandsons and eight great grandchildren.

Services were held at the First Baptist Church, Union, S.C. with interment following in the Union Memorial Gardens.”



Writer’s comments; Coming to [Glendale](#) about the mid-twenties, the Cash family quickly became prominent in the community. They lived in one of the original houses built for supervisors between 1832-35 by [Dr. Bivings](#), founder of [Bivingsville/Glendale Mills](#). The house was located on what was first called [Main](#) Street, then [Shady Street](#) and is known today as [Douglas Street](#). Mr. Cash and all his children worked for [Glendale Mills](#) at some point in their life. After coming back from the war, Lucille worked in the [Mill Store](#), [Café and Canteen](#).

The family was faithful attendees of the [Glendale Baptist Church](#) with most becoming members. Mr. Cash served as Deacon for a number of years while his daughter Kate,

taught a Sunday School Class for many years. After her marriage, Mary Cash Alley joined the [Methodist Church](#) with her husband, Earnest, both becoming leaders. They were loved and greatly appreciated throughout the community. Mr. Cash's untimely death brought deep sorrow to his church and village.
