Writer's comments; I only knew Tom and Frank Lee and their families. Both were good employees of the [Glendale Mills](#). Frank was quite an innovator. He with his partner, B. B. Rogers, developed and patented several pieces` of mill equipment. In studying the census records, it seems that the Lee farms were located between [Bivingsville](#) and [Pacolet](#) which resulted in registering in both communities.
