I have tried to copy the census as recorded, where errors occur, I apologize. Death certificates are not available in Spartanburg for years before 1917 and Obituaries have not been put on microfilm for the years 1924 through 1929.

The 1940 Spartanburg/Glendale Census listed the household as;

Winnie Sentell, 65, widow/head of household.

Son; Garner 38, carpenter with cotton mill/born in North Carolina.

Obituary records show that;

Winnie Sentell, wife of John Garner Sentell, died at the age of 86 in October, 1956.

No record of the death of John Garner Sr. was found.

John Garner Sentell, her son, died at the age of 69 in May, 1971.
